



FAITH KIDS CAMP SCHOLARSHIP

FEBRUARY - APRIL



2ND - 6TH GRADE



We at Faith want to help grow kids in their relationship with Christ. To that end, we're contributing \$150 toward an approved Christian Camp for students from Faith Baptist Church who complete the requirements below.

Complete at least 1 activity from each of the 5 tracks between February and April

GET INVOLVED

- Sunday School: Attend 8 Sunday school classes.
- Awana: Attend 6 Awana club meetings.

MEMORIZE

- Memorize 13 individual verses.** These can be verses from school, from the Scholarship verse sheets, or verses that have been approved by Scholarship staff.
- Memorize a passage of at least 6 verses.** (*The same rules apply from above.*)

LEARN

- Sermon Notes:** Complete and hand in 6 weeks of notes from adult worship service or kid's large group.
- Bible Application:** Write 1-2 sentences for the verses you memorized in the "Memorize" section, explaining in your own words what the verse means and how it applies to you.

READ

- Daily Devotional:** Use a devotional book, magazine, or Bible reading plan and study the Bible for 6 weeks.
- Book Report:** Read a book from the church's children's library (or another approved Christian book) and write a 1-page report.

REACH OUT

- Letter:** Write a two-page letter to a shut-in, college student, or missionary.
- Prayer Record:** Pray for others every day for 4 weeks.
- Interview:** Talk to someone you don't know well who works in missions or Christian education.
- Evangelism:** Bring a friend to Awana or Sunday school.
- Service:** Do a service project that takes at least an hour.

PARENTS:

When work is completed and you've chosen a camp, **submit a payment form.** Checks will be mailed in early May.

MORE DETAILS

GET INVOLVED:

Attendance: Attendance needs to take place during the Scholarship period. Have your teacher or Awana leaders sign the Attendance Form and turn it in at the end of the Scholarship period (or once you've attended the required number.)

MEMORIZE:

Memorization: Verses or passages not on the verse sheets need to be approved by the Camp Scholarship staff before memorizing them. Awana verses do qualify, but only verses, not section completions or tasks. Be sure to bring in your signed Awana book or school work each week to the Camp Scholarship table to be checked. Verses must be recited to Camp Scholarship staff. A passage is several verses in a row up to a whole chapter, and needs to be recited in order.

LEARN:

Sermon Notes: Forms are available at the Camp Scholarship Program table or outside the sanctuary. Kids in 2-6th can fill out these forms based on regular adult worship time, children's large group, or a combination of both.

Bible Application: Write 1-2 sentences for 9 of the verses you memorized, explaining in your own words what the verse means and how it applies to you.

READ:

Daily Devotional: Forms are available at the Camp Scholarship Program table or kids can use their own journal with dates for each day. Devotional forms or journals need to be completed each week, for at least 5 days per week, and presented to the Camp Scholarship Program staff when the 6 weeks have been completed.

Book Report: Read a chapter book from the church's children's library (or another approved Christian book). Write a 1-page report. Half of it should be what happened in the book, and the other half should be what you learned that can help you better follow Christ.

REACH OUT:

Letter: Write a two-page letter (or 1 page and a drawing) to a shut-in, college student, or missionary. This should not be a relative or someone you normally write letters to. Show a copy or photo of the letter to Camp Scholarship Staff before mailing.

Prayer: Pray for others daily for 4 weeks. Ask a parent to listen while you pray for someone you know who needs prayer. Try to pray for specific needs this person has. Fill out the Prayer Form showing who you prayed for on each date.

Interview: Talk to someone you don't know well who works in Christian Education or Missions. Fill out the Interview/Evangelism Form about the interview. Include their name, how and where they serve the Lord, and what you learned.

Evangelism: Bring a friend to Awana or Sunday School. Fill out the Interview/Evangelism Form telling who you brought and why it's important to bring friends to church and share the gospel with them.

Service: Do a service project that takes at least an hour. It should be something that will help someone and that you don't do on a regular basis (it can't be cleaning your room or regular chores). Fill out the Service Form and turn it in.
